## Weekly Guide to Daily Prayer

We can easily spend this week asking for the grace to use the gifts we've been given. We want to recognize that we have gifts, and that they are, in fact, gifts. We didn't earn them, we were entrusted with them. We can reflect upon the potential each gift has and how we might develop and use each gift we have more completely - in loving, in making a difference on behalf of the poor in our world.

We can all make a list of the ruts we are in. We can get very specific about the patterns which define why some of our relationships aren't very good or why we don't do very well with tensions or conflicts at work. And, if we get very reflective about it, we can make an even bigger list of what we "fail to do" - the things we know we should do but never get around to doing. It becomes very difficult to care for the poor if I don't see or have any occasion to notice.

Paul said it in his letter to the Romans, chapter 15-19 "I do not do the good I want, but do the evil I do not want".

So, what do we do? What is the path to real conversion, real change? We know that seeking grace from the Sacrament of Reconciliation can be very powerful. God's mercy can not only forgive us but also heal us. When we experience unconditional love deeply enough, we can find the desire to change coming right out of our gratitude.

When God's grace meets a place in our hearts that is ready, eager, and open to change and the patterns we find ourselves stuck in are no longer "our friends" but our real enemies, then we begin to feel a readiness to accept his grace and move forward. Our gifts, or talents, are given to us for the service of others. If we make use of our gifts in service to the Kingdom of Heaven, we will be rewarded. The Gospel reminds us that Christian spirituality is not passive or inactive. Ourlife of prayer helps us to discern the gifts

that have been given to us by God. This prayer and discernment ought to lead us to use our gifts in the service of God and our neighbour. God's grace allows us to share in the work of serving the Kingdom of Heaven.
