Weekly Guide to Daily Prayer

A regular way of reporting some important news today is to cite the source "according to a highly placed government official", even when the source is anonymous. We give the story credibility if it seems to come from an authoritative source, deserving credibility. Jesus tells us clearly that the source of his message and his power is God, the Father, himself.

This week we can experience intimacy with God in the midst of our busy lives if we take brief moments throughout our day, every day, to let the connection between ourselves and God become conscious. We forget who we are. We get distracted by the world around us, even with things that our duty or commitment. To become more conscious of the presence of God with us in our busy days takes some practice. It is a matter of desire and choice. If we desire it, we will choose it. And it takes a method. This week we can wake each morning and let our first thoughts turn to our Lord and our relationship. "Good morning, Lord. Thank you for letting me be your disciple today. Help me to be connected with you throughout this day. With your love, help me to be freer and more grateful, in the midst of my experiences today. Lord, help me to be more simple, authentic, transparent and trusting today. I don't want to try to be someone else."

This week we can ask to experience humility and grace in the real limits we experience our lives. All of us have some places where we come to know our humanity and are brought to our knees. Perhaps we continue to be judgemental of others even after asking for forgiveness ourselves, we present ourselves one way in public, but act in a very different way with those closest to us, we never get round to acts of generosity and charity, perhaps even with members of our own families.

St. Paul tells us we have been called to care for each other and to acknowledge that there is one God who is father to us all, making us all brothers and sisters.

Let us pray: Almighty and ever-living God. Increase our faith, hope and charity, and make us love what you command, so that we may merit what your promised. Amen.
