Since the site was launched on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Advent, 2016, visitor numbers have grown steadily and now average in the region of a thousand a month. The site is inspired by Pope Francis' enthusiasm for the Internet. He urges Christians to "walk the streets of the digital highways... Let us boldly become citizens of the digital world... in order to dialogue with people today and to help them encounter Christ".

New Pilgrim Path is aimed at helping fellow Christian travellers of all denominations to mine the rich resources of the Web in the search for meaning and belonging. Because the choice is so huge and, at times, bewildering, we provide a brief description of every site we have visited. This aims at helping visitors to New Pilgrim Path find the sites that are likely to be relevant and interesting to them at the particular stage of their journey. We have pages devoted to a range of resources, including daily prayer, Divine Office, online retreats, inspirational reflections, spiritual poetry, religious broadcasts, and many others. Each week, we feature a "Website of the Week" which we promote through parish newsletters. Every Monday, we send a description of the next week's featured site to the Parish Priest, Rector or Parish Secretary (see example below), and increasing numbers of parishes insert this in their newsletters.



**Weekly Guide to Daily Prayer**

A vision of comfort and healing is offered for the Thirtieth Sunday of Ordinary Time. In Jeremiah we see the Lord gathering his people, the blind, the lame and the helpless innocents, bringing them together to console and guide them. Jesus repeats that it will not be easy to enter the Kingdom: "For behold, some are last who will be first and some are first who will be last. He encourages us to be humble.

Please, Lord, anything but humility! Our instinctive reaction to humility might be the result of a culture that exalts riches, honours and pride. Yet all this week Jesus teaches us that the way to salvation is through humility.

The first step might be simply asking for the desire to be humble. As we move through the simplest of moments in our everyday lives, we can stop and ask God to help us want to be humble. As we start our day we can keep a running prayer in the background of our consciousness; "Lord, help me to desire the humility that will make me more aware of your saving grace". The background moments offer ways for us to recognize opportunities to practice humility as we go through our days.

Perhaps I can stop myself from correcting my spouse. In a disagreement, I might make an extra effort to listen to the other person's side rather than planning my rebuttal as they speak. I can let the person in the queue go ahead of me, hold the door for someone or make an extra effort to recognize and thank those who serve me. Maybe I can even admit that I may not fully understand the opinions of others and that there may be some legitimate points to them. Even these tiny

gestures, when done in the spirit of Jesus' teaching this week, offer us a special grace.

All week we can continue to speak to the Lord as we would to a loving friend who listens to us. And always, we can end our day in gratitude for the merciful God who loves us so compassionately and longs to be in our hearts.

We pray:

May your grace O Lord, at all times go before us and follow after us, and make us always determined to carry out good works.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, you Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.
